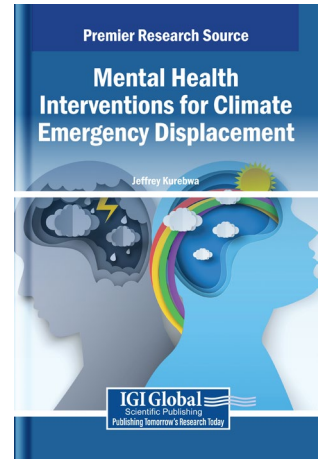


Mental Health Interventions for Climate Emergency Displacement
