The mission of WFCF is to provide medical care and treatment to orphaned and abandoned children in third world countries. Why do it? Why do we do it? Why should you do it? Yes, we believe that we are responsible for the welfare of our brothers and sisters, regardless of where they are or whatever their age is. And for that reason, WFCF tries to reach out to children all over the world. We also believe that orphaned and abandoned are at great disadvantage relative to adults within and outside of their homeland.
